


With the rise in popularity of astrology, there is this candle based on your birth date and zodiac signs. It has a specialized smell and has facts about your personality.





The saint of December is Juan Diego. St. Juan Diego is an important saint because of his special relationship with Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mary, Mother of God. St. Juan Diego had converted to Catholicism under the influence of Spanish colonizers. One day, on his way to church, he saw a beautiful woman appear, proclaiming she was the Virgin Mary. Our Lady asked Juan Diego to have a church where they stood, Tepeyac hill. St. Juan Diego obeyed and went to the Bishop and told him what had occurred, but the Bishop didn't believe him.

The next day, Juan met Our Lady again and said that he did not have enough proof that she had appeared. 

Recipes To Try

How to make Chewy Chocolate chip Cookies:

Things you need:

- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
 - ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- ³/₄ cup unsalted butter melted and cooled just until opaque
 - 1 cup brown sugar
 - ½ cup granulated sugar
 - 1 egg room temperature
 - 1 egg yolk room temperature
 - 1 ½ cups semi-sweet chocolate chips

Insturctions

- 1. Whisk together the melted butter, brown sugar and granulated sugar in a large bowl for two minutes.
- Whisk in the vanilla extract, egg and egg yolk until the mixture is light and creamy.
- 3. Add the flour, baking soda, corn starch and salt and mix just until combined.
 - Stir in the chocolate chips.
- Scoop out cookie dough, about 1/4 cup per cookie, and roll the dough balls in your hands until smooth. Place on a parchment lined baking sheet and chill in refrigerator for 1 hour or in the the freezer for 30 minutes.
 - Bake for 12-15 mins




Home Alone Summary






OSM's Christmas Traditions
